DRAWING MATERIALS

Graphite Pencils: H,HB,B,2B or Generals Charcoal Pencils or Nitram Charcoal (B, HB, H) or

Prismacolor Col-Erase (Erasable pencils) colors: BROWN or

BLACK White Chalk (Generals)

Paper: Fabriano Artistico/ Hot Press/ 90lb or 140 lb

Paper size should be about 18x24, or 16x20. You can work smaller, but the paper size should be able to fit their composition of a life size, or slightly under life-size skull.

Toned paper is ok. You can purchase already toned paper like Canson, or you can tone the paper yourself. I like to use the Fabriano Artistico Hot Press and tone it with an ink wash. You can also choose paper that you are most comfortable with - these are simply some suggestions.

Chamois Cloth Paper Stumps Rubber Eraser

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Small Pocket Mirror
Measuring tool (knitting needle, chopstick, or thin paintbrush)
Drawing Board
Sanding Block
X-Acto Knife (or box cutter for sharpening)

Optional:

Old T-shirt piece (About 8" square)
2 or 3 small brushes (Bristle or sable)
India Ink or Walnut Ink for paper toning (If toning paper)
