Painting Supplies List:

- -6"x8" primed boards and one 9" x 12" primed board (New Traditions C13 panels or Centurion Double Primed Oil Panels are great, but any primed board will work fine)
- -Sealed wooden palette, a glass palette or neutral grey palette paper
- -Gamsol/Turpenoid.
- -Air-tight aluminum brush washer
- -Paper towels
- -Linseed oil and/or Oleogel
- -Glass jars to store medium
- -Double palette cup with screw caps
- -Metal palette knife
- -Ivory Short Flats for massing in during the block-in phase (I recommend Rosemary brushes or Silver Bristlon brushes in sizes 0, 2, 4, 6 and 8)
- -Flat and round oil and acrylic brushes in various sizes I highly recommend purchasing at least a few Michael Klein pointed rounds if possible! Princeton Select Round brushes and Round Sable Brushes also work just fine.
- -Any sort of brush container or carrier—It can be as simple as a large mason jar!

Colors:

- -Titanium and/or Cremintz White*
- -Ivory Black*
- -Raw Umber (Michael Harding)*
- -Asphaltum (Gamblin)
- -Raw Sienna
- -Burnt Sienna*
- -Yellow Ochre*
- -Naples Yellow, Mussini Brilliant Yellow OR Lead Tin Yellow Light
- -Naphthol Red or Cadmium Red Light*
- -Alizarin Crimson*
- -Cobalt Blue*
- -King's Blue Light
- -Viridian OR Sap Green

Set Up:

- -Any easel will work for this class as long as it can hold both your reference and your painting!
- -For lighting, any light will do as long as it lights both your reference and your painting equally. You can use natural daylight from a window, but if you're working in the evening or if you need supplemental lighting, I highly recommend using a 5000K daylight bulb and a clamp light from any hardware store to light your work.
